

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Gray Water System Monitoring Requirements Not Met for IOCs

Our community water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the monitoring compliance period of 07/01/2024 – 09/30/2024, we did not test for Inorganic Chemicals (IOCs) and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What happened? What is being done?

Water treatment plant (WTP) staff failed to obtain the appropriate sampling kits from the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GA EPD), without which, required sampling could not take place.

A policy has been developed and implemented dictating that the WTP Operator will take reasonable and appropriate action to follow up with GA EPD should sampling kits not be received within the first week of each quarter. Sampling will be performed, and sampling kits returned to GA EPD within one week of receiving the sampling kits from GA EPD.

Regular monitoring has taken place since this violation, and the City of Gray Water System has returned to compliance with monitoring standards.
