

PRESS RELEASE ANNOUNCING A PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX INCREASE
Millage Rate to Remain the Same

The City of Gray City Council announces its intention to increase the 2020 property taxes it will levy this by **0.11** percent over the rollback millage rate.

Each year, the board of tax assessors is required to review the Assessed value for property tax purposes of taxable property in the county. When the trend of prices on properties that have recently sold within the incorporate area of the county indicate there has been an increase in the fair market value of any specific property, the board of tax assessors is required by law to re-determine the value of such property and adjust the assessment. This is called a reassessment.

When the total digest of taxable property is prepared, Georgia law requires that a rollback millage rate must be computed that will produce the same total revenue on the current year's digest that last year's millage rate would have produced had no reassessments occurred.

The budget tentatively adopted by the City of Gray City Council requires that a millage rate higher than the rollback millage rate, therefore, before the City of Gray City Council may finalize the tentative budget and set a final millage rate, Georgia law requires three public hearings to be held to allow the public an opportunity to express their opinions on the increase.

All concerned citizens are invited to the public hearings on this tax increase to be held at the DV Childs Civic Center located at 109 James Street, Gray, GA 31032 on September 21, 2020 at 10:00 am and 6:00 pm. A third hearing will be held on October 5th, 2020 @ 6:00pm at the DV Childs Civic Center 109 James Street, Gray, GA 31032. The millage rate will be adopted at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on October 5th, 2020 after the public hearing.
