

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Mayor and Council for the City of Gray, Georgia was held on Monday, August 2, 2021 at 6:00pm in the D.V. Childs Civic Center.

Present: Mayor Ed Barbee, Mayor Pro Tem James Collins, Council Members David Tufts, Terrell Fulford and Terry Favors, City Attorney John Newberry, City Superintendent Frank Ross, City Clerk Cindy Yancey, and Assistant City Clerk Ashley Roberson.

Mayor Barbee called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Councilman Tufts gave the invocation, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Tufts made a motion, seconded by Councilman Favors, and unanimously voted to approve the August 2, 2021 agenda.
