

A meeting of all committees of the City of Gray, Georgia was held on Monday, May 16, 2023, in the conference room at City Hall located at 109 James Street

Present: Mayor Pro Tem James Collins, Council Member David Tufts, City Attorney John Newberry, City Superintendent Cheyenne Morgan, Main Street Director Ashley Roberson, and Assistant City Clerk Heather Brown.

Mayor Pro Tem Collins called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Finance/Tax Committee:

- Financial Update –
98.43% of the 2022 property tax has been collected, leaving an unpaid balance of \$16,646.85.

Water/Sewer Committee:

Plan Committee:

- Mayor Pro Tem Collins stated that this Saturday May 20th is trash clean-up day for the county and the city. Per Mr. Collins if anyone expresses interest direct them to him or Main Street Director Ashley Roberson.
 - Councilman Tufts stated he thought the city helped with this in years prior.
 - Mrs. Roberson stated she asked if any help from the city was needed.
 - City Superintendent Cheyenne Morgan stated that he will ask some of the public works employees to participate.

- Main Street Director Ashley Roberson stated she is working to have vendors sign up for the New Farmers Market event that will be held the 2nd & 4th Saturday of each month starting in June from 8:30-12:00.

Streets/Sanitation Committee:

- City Superintendent Morgan gave an update regarding the plans and specifications for the Dolly Street drainage project which will go out tomorrow to some of the local contractors and be open for bidding for 2 weeks.
- Main Street Director Ashley Roberson gave an update that DDA paid for a landscape design artist to design a plan for the bump outs along Atlanta Rd. Mrs. Roberson stated that with the help from the public works department everything will be dug out. Mrs. Roberson has submitted the plans to some local landscapers for estimates.

- City Attorney John Newberry stated the county is working to implement a golf cart tag process. This if passed would allow golf carts on roads 25 mph or less. This is still in the early stages of discussion.
